Annemarie has been a speaker at numerous regional and national conferences, and has conducted grand rounds seminars, resident lectures, and staff training on various medical/legal issues over the course of her health care legal career. She has edited a book chapter related to representing hospitals and health systems for the American Health Lawyers Association, and co-authored A Practical Guide to Informed Consent.
